FLORAL DESIGN DIVISION

CLASS I - Eiffel Tower The Iron Lady a symbol of love 6 entries

Symmetrical Triangle Design: an evenly balanced, three-sided floral composition having the form of a triangle. Designs will be staged on 42" high pedestal with a 30" round top. Design may not extend more than 5" from the edge of the pedestal in width or depth; there are no height restrictions.

CLASS 2 - Croissant

6 Entries

Nothing better than Paris in the morning with a warm croissant and coffee

A Crescent Shaped Design: Viewed from three sides. Staged on a pedestal 42 "high with a 30" round top. Design may include an overlay, but not extend pass the edge pedestal top in width or depth; there is no height restriction.

CLASS 3 – Jardin a la Française

6 Entries

A Pot et Fleur: A deign featuring rooted plant material and/or rooted bulbs combined with cut flowers and/or cut plant material. To be displayed on a table approximately 29" from the floor. Arrangement must not exceed 24" width by 36" high. Viewed from all sides.

Floral Design Rules

- 1. The artistic division may be entered individually or in a group up to three people.
- 2. A "Novice Exhibitor" is someone who has never won a blue ribbon for a flower arrangement in a judged competition. If entering an exhibit with a partner or as part of a small group, all participants must be novices to be eligible for "Novice Exhibitor" status.
- 3. All exhibits must feature a predominance of daffodils.
- 4. Beauty, originality and creativity are the most important principals in judging.
- 5. A brief statement of intent may be used in all classes and must be on a 4x6 inch card (or smaller) with a maximum of thirty words.
- 6. Accessories may be used in all classes. An "accessory" is anything other than the plant material, base, mechanics, background, underlayment or container used in the design. All accessories must be subordinate to the plant material in the exhibit.
- 7. Dry plant material may be incorporated into any design; however, fresh plant material must predominate and be fresh and well conditioned.
- 8. Daffodils may not be treated in any manner or way. "Treated" means application of any substance that changes surface, color or texture by the application of any treating material, including and not limited to: wax, dye (vegetative or otherwise), paint, shellac, lacquer, oil, flocking and shoe polish.
- 9. Exhibitors may bring their entries to Show on Wednesday, April 20, between the hours of 7a.m to 9 a.m. The Committee must pass (accept) all exhibits for entry into the show. Judging will take place on Wednesday, April 20 starting at 10 a.m.
- 10. Exhibitors must retrieve their exhibits on Thursday April 21 between 4 p.m. and 5 p.m. The Committee will consider any exhibit not so retrieved to be a donation to the Show.

Rules:

- 1 One photograph per exhibitor per class. Daffodils must be featured in entries.
- 2 Each photograph must be matted (no frame or glass).
- 3- Photograph must be at least 5 x 7, no larger than 8 x 10, prior to matting.
- 4 Name and phone number of entrant should be written on back of entry but not visible to the judges. The top of photograph must be indicated.
- 5 Macro class: An image in which the subject is greater than life size. The original object must be no larger than 1" x 1.5"
- 6 Creative Image Class: Entries must display unusual characteristics suggested by, but not limited to, abstraction, alternative media and techniques, camera movement, chemical or physical manipulation, digital exposure and collages. Simply using unusual angles, extreme close ups, abstract subjects or unusual situations does not qualify an image for this category.
- 7 Still life: A photograph of an arrangement of elements depicting inanimate subject matter, typically natural or manmade, creatively arranged in scenes that tell a story.
 8 Submission and pick-up must occur in accordance with the schedule above. Late entries will not be accepted, and the committee reserves the right to discard items not picked up in a timely manner.
