



See the judging results of an amazing show!



“I’ve always wanted to be a wildlife biologist, doing fieldwork and science,” exclaims Dr. Liz Kalies, Director of Science for the Nature Conservancy’s North Carolina Chapter. As a recipient of a GCA scholarship in ecological restoration, Dr. Kalies was scheduled to speak at the 2020 Annual Meeting in Asheville, NC. Her impressive work has continued since she was a scholar in 2008.

## Learn About this Accomplished Scholar

According to the American Public Garden Association (APGA), mandatory stay-home orders have resulted in 96% of botanical gardens across the country being completely (60%) or partially (36%) closed! Unattended plants can die, in some cases, overnight.

The GCA has joined the APGA to advocate for \$130 million in emergency funding to be included in an upcoming stimulus package by writing a letter to Congress.

In addition, the Great American Outdoors Act will be discussed by the Senate in June. Contact your state's US Senators and share your voice.
